



I have always loved that story. It reminds us that sometimes God will let us get to a point where we can't go on so He can show us how much He loves us, and how willing He is to help. I find comfort in that because it reminds me that even though things may seem out of control from my perspective, nothing is happening that God can't overcome at a moment's notice. It also reminds us that no matter what we're dealing with or how alone we may feel, we have a God that's watching with the intensity of a Father protecting His children.

If you're going through something right now that seems to be lasting longer than you expected, and you're not sure why, I want you to know your heavenly Father sees, and He has the power to come charging through even the most stubborn challenge, and carry you the rest of the way. I hope this encourages you. God bless, and I'll see you on Sunday!
