

SPOT-LIGHT ON... The Assistance Fund Committee

The Assistance Fund Committee was established 10 years ago for the purpose of evaluating requests for aid and directing disbursement of funds donated for this purpose. Prior to that the assistance fund monies were administered directly by the Consistory but their monthly business meetings didn't allow the time necessary to do the job well.

Needs that are brought to the Committee's attention are evaluated on an individual basis—often including personal interviews. Financial counseling may be encouraged in some cases. Assistance is not limited to members.

The Committee meets monthly to consider needs presented to them . Communication with the committee may be initiated by speaking to any of the committee members, or through the church office or pastors.

As a church we seek to minister to the whole individual, working to meet both spiritual and physical needs. The Assistance Committee and the funds it manages are part of that goal.


