Hi Shepherd! As I write this it is hard to believe we are coming into April and are already a quarter of the way through 2017. Even though we just went through the biggest snowstorm of the season, I am eagerly anticipating the coming of spring. I have always been passionate about the creation story and am excited to share that passion with you!

It is also my hope that by gaining an even better understanding of the text of scripture on Wednesday nights, you will be able to take even more away from the application of scripture on Sunday morning. That also means, feel encouraged to **invite your friends**! Even if they attend other churches, they are welcome to join us on Wednesdays. There will be no effort whatsoever to draw them away from their home church, but rather by using what they learn at *Magnifi* they will be better equipped to strengthen their own congregations and more prepared to receive their pastor's message Sunday morning. In this way we can also better Connect with the people in the community around us, which is, if you remember, one of the three ways we want to Connect this year.

You can expect a casual and condensed service, designed to help build your connection with God, which is yet another way we want to Connect better. I should also emphasize that this is not designed to replace the regular Sunday service but rather augment it. Having said that, however, we all understand with summer come summer vacations. Therefore, if you are unable to attend service on Sunday you will have another opportunity to worship. In addition, it will also provide everyone an opportunity to connect with people you might not regularly see on Sunday (yet another one of our Connect goals for this year).

So, with all of that being said, let me **personally invite each of you to** *Magnifi Genesis*, **starting May 3**. It will be a great way to spend spring and summer Wednesday nights and I look forward to spending them with you all! God bless and see you there!

The Mission Commitment Project for April is David and Lee Hall of Marrakech, Morocco. David continues to serve as pastor of the Marrakech congregation, which is part of the Evangelical Church of Morocco. The congregation is diverse, consisting mainly of sub-Saharan African Christians from over 15 countries, but also including some European members.



When they arrived church attendance was 100 or less, but now is averaging 150-170. David calls this a "blessed problem." They need more room. Since the country is over 99% Muslim, getting all the permissions necessary to expand the church would be difficult. They are considering a tile floor with a tent enclosure, which would be defined as temporary. This would not require government approval.

David also has responsibilities at the national level in the area of worship and music. He has participated in weekend events and seminary classes for the training of musicians and hymnology.

Lee continues to work in discipleship and women's ministries and counseling. While she is not a professional photographer, she is a great camera enthusiast. Recently she put together a new photo book that is called *Morocco, A country of beauty and intrigue*. It is a book which matches scripture passages to pictures of the gorgeous country side of Morocco.




