



In January we launched our Bible College ministry and it's going very well. Students are learning a lot and growing in their faith, and even having some fun along the way. Maybe you noticed the video we created and posted to Facebook. If you did, share it with your friends. We just finished enrolling for our 2018-2019 class and if all goes as planned we will have more than half-a-dozen churches represented through students in classes. Thank you to all who help do this and for your prayers and support!

Another thing we did was to update our church's bylaws. While not the most interesting thing, I admit, it was greatly needed. Elders and Deacons met for hours on end to provide you with something we can all be proud of. Thank you to all who helped to make that happen!

We said goodbye to Pastor Derrick who went into full-time missionary work but at the same time we received two new outstanding pastors, Charles and Lucas. They've been with us for about six months now and have acclimated well. Charles, our Executive Pastor, has been handling much of the adult ministries and the pastoral administrative duties, while Lucas has been handling the youth and worship ministries.

We experienced some natural disasters in this nation with hurricane after hurricane hitting the southern states. You all rallied and together though and we sent almost \$7,000 in aide through Samaritan's Purse, in addition to our regular missions support. Thank you for your help and for making a difference!

We had a Luau in September that was a lot of fun. Around 350 people attended and I'm told the music could be heard almost a mile away. We had such a great time we're already talking about doing one next year, so tell your friends to watch for it!

And speaking of music, you probably noticed we had several musical guests this year. We've been working to bring you guest artists as we are able. The truth is we have more that are interested than we can bring at any one time, which is great! This year we welcomed Allan Scott, Behold the Beloved, and Final Harvest – twice, and we're already working on groups for next year.

Something else we launched this year was our radio ministry called Light the Way through 107.5 Alive. The response to the program has been great! I'm told the program can be heard as far as New Jersey and Gettysburg.

In addition, we went through several major teaching series. We started the year with "Under Construction," looking at how God builds us up. Then, over the summer, we studied the book of Philippians in a series called "Happy Dance," looking at the joy we have in the Lord. Finally, we concluded the year with "Unshakable," looking at the book of 1st Peter for guidance in navigating a world hostile to the Christian faith. We're already planning for a series in January and will be announcing that soon!

It's been a great year with you all and we're eagerly looking forward to next year to see what God will do. One thing is for certain, He is moving here at Shepherd!

The Mission Commitment Project for December is Howard McFarland, associated with the international student ministry of SPADE. in Kempton, PA. Howard's wife, Charlotte, passed away in February of this year after a season of failing health. SPADE has designated a memorial project in honor of Charloette. It is a one room, historic brick building on the SPADE property that is going to be restored as "Charlottte's Cottage" and used in a way that reflects her loving and joyful spirit.. Howard is now retired and lives with his daughter in Colorado Springs, Colordo.

The Vision Project for December is Bob and Carmen Morrison with ConeXion Mosaico. ConeXion Mosaico is an organization whose objective is to bring aabout city transformation and at the same time expand God's kingdom. They work in holistic church planting, research and community development.

The Morrisons are based in Chimalhuacan, Mexico, on the outskirts of Mexico City. This is a slum area where there is a high rate of domestic abuse, poverty, violence and spiritual emptiness.

This is the second year Bob and Carmen have been in this ministry. Carmen's skills are being put to use by providing marriage counseling, parenting classes, and recovery guidance for the abused. Bob's work emphasis is in communications and fundraising aspects of the organization.
